Call for Papers – Submission Guidelines

Send one electronic copy in an email entitled "BAAL06_oneinitialsurname", e.g. "BAAL06_fbrown", in an attachment also entitled "BAAL06_oneinitialsurname" to lucette@iol.ie

Label and format your abstract like this:

- Title in bold
- Name in bold
- Affiliation, address, tel. and email
- Text 300 words maximum
- Single-spaced
- Justified
- Times New Roman 12

Indicate the type of abstract that you are submitting:

- 20-minute individual paper for the parallel sessions
- paper for a Special Interest Group (SIG) track (this is submitted on its own) say which –
 - UK Linguistic Ethnography Forum
 - Corpus Linguistics
 - Psycholinguistics
 - Multi-modality
 - Language Teaching and Learning
 - Language in Africa
 - Language and Gender
- proposed colloquium paper (this is submitted along with the other papers in the colloquium, and the title of the colloquium on the conference theme or a multi/cross-cultural issue)
- poster

NOTES

- Individual papers have 40 minutes: 20 for the presentation, 20 for questions
- SIG tracks and Colloquia have 160 minutes (one half day) and a minimum of four papers.
- Colloquia proposers should plan their half day in four slots, in step with the individual paper slots. If they wish to have a larger number of papers, they can fit two papers into what would normally be a single slot. Colloquia papers should cohere. The order of the papers should not be changed after acceptance.
- There will be a maximum of four proposed colloquia and six SIG tracks.
- All abstracts will be anonymously rated by the Meetings Secretary, two members of the Local Organising Committee, and one other Executive Committee member.
- Indicate whether you want a scholarship.

Scholarships

BAAL offers eight UK student scholarships and one International hardship scholarship. The UK scholarships cover registration and accommodation, but not meals and travel. The International scholarship, worth £1,000, goes towards registration, accommodation, meals and travel.
